It is my particular pleasure to formally announce the official creation of Kuumba's very own Shared Interest Group (SIG) within the Harvard Alumni Association, *The Alumni of the Kuumba Singers of Harvard College*. If you sang, danced or provided musical accompaniment with Kuumba, you are automatically a member of our SIG!

Ours is truly an amazing story. An organization begun by two students, Dennis Wiley and Fred Lucas from the Class of 1972...with the torch of creativity and spirituality nurtured and dutifully passed along by only three choir directors—Hubert Walters, Robert Winfrey and now Sheldon K. X. Reid—and by more than 1,000 of us who have ministered to ourselves and others through song for close to 40 years.

On the occasion of the 35th anniversary of the Kuumba Singers, the alumni gathered en masse and contributed the remaining funds required to consummate the choir's endowment. As we approached this significant 40th year milestone, we felt that it was a fitting time to take yet another step to assure the long-term viability of our beloved Kuumba organization—the formation of our alumni association. Our mission is to formally connect Kuumba alumni for the purposes of sustaining meaningful community among alumni and supporting the current Kuumba Singers in their fulfillment of Kuumba's mission.

Via our Articles of Incorporation, which can be found on Kuumba's website, we have laid an initial framework for an organization that will ultimately be shaped entirely by your involvement. Thus far, we have envisioned an active network of regional groups of Kuumba alums who gather periodically to socialize-and sing. And we have imagined an easily-organized web of alums who can work together in groups to facilitate choir tours in their communities, provide technical assistance and financial support to the current choir, and embrace and support new graduates who join our ranks as alumni.
